MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK, May 26. (U.P.)—Financial spirits were pegged up a few notches by congressional action on the tax bill today. News that Wall Street's net, the sales tax, was gaining favor in both house and senate led to a brisk rally in stocks, bonds and commodities.

Coincident with the rise in stocks was a big increase in activity. The largest number of issues since last December was traded in and the day's turnover of 1,800,000 came closer to the 2,000,000 mark than at any time since early April.

Before the turn came, in the early afternoon, stocks had been forced down to new lows on the "bear" movement, but the recovery was rapid when the news from Washington invaded the stock exchange floor. Shorts, scrambling to cover, added impetus to the upturn.

Steel jumped from 27 1/2 to 28 1/2, American Telephone 92 1/2 to 94 1/2, General Electric 11 1/2 to 12 1/2, Can 35 1/2 to 37 1/2, Standard of New Jersey 23 1/2 to 24 1/2, and Allied Chemical 49 1/2 to 51.

A real short squeeze developed in Du Pont, which soared from 25 1/2 to 29 when the market rallied. Although some of the top prices were shaded before the close, leading stocks were up fractions to more than two points at the close.

Another selling barrage against tobacco stocks was a feature of the session. Although they rallied later with the rest of the list, shares of the group were lower at the close. Reynolds Tobacco B was the most active stock on the board, spurring from a low of 27 1/2 to 29 1/2, and closing at 28 1/2, off 1.

Rail and utilities, which had been dumped again in the early trading and showed losses of 1 to 4 points, recovered and closed higher. Union Pacific rallied from 35 1/2 to 39 1/2. Atchafalaya closed more than a point higher at 27 1/2.

Auburn Auto showed a 2 point gain at the end of the session. Merchandising stocks like Montgomery Ward and Sears Roebuck climbed sharply higher on a rise in wheat which accompanied the stock market rally. Grain also slumped early, but recovered to near the previous closing levels.

Led by United States government issues, the bond market perked up, but the governments were the only group able to overcome the effects of an earlier decline and close higher.

Before the liquidation was stopped, practically every active railroad issue on the board had been driven down to a new low and corporation loans fared little better.

Cotton slumped early on the failure of an old Liverpool brokerage house, but recovered most of the losses later when outside markets rallied.
