EVERYDAY MOVIES

By OTTO E. STRUM (United Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, May 27 (U.P.)—Stocks were jolted out of a state of lethargy late today by an unexpected cut in the General Electric dividend from \$1 to 40 cents annually.

Weakness in General Electric spread to other stocks. Steel sold off to within a fraction of its bear market low of 26 3/4.

Trading was dull and throughout the greater part of the day stocks backed and filled in a narrow range. News was unproductive of any incentive to traders to take the bull by the horns, or the bear by the tail, and get into the market on either side.

Prospects that a receivership for the St. Louis Southwestern (Cotton Belt) railway would be averted by agreement on a refunding plan failed to inject new life into railroad stocks, though the did inspire a 10-point spurt in Cotton Belt as on the bond market.

Motor shares, which early in the session displayed some improvement on more optimistic reports from the industry, saw their gains melt away in the late reaction.

Public utility stocks also were sold steadily again and at the close Consolidated Gas, Public Service, North American and others were lodged behind sizable minus signs.

J. C. FISHER GOES TO LONG BEACH

Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Fisher, who have been in Las Vegas since September, are leaving this morning for Long Beach for the summer. While there they plan to stop at the Villa Riviera.

Fisher became interested in Las Vegas in 1911, when James G. Givens, one of Las Vegas' early entrepreneurs and for a time president of the chamber of commerce, induced him to come west to look over the new territory.

On that first visit to Vegas, Fisher bought the 626 acres he now owns just east of Vegas and planned to build a reservoir on the high ground on Charleston boulevard and supply the entire tract with artesian water.

Fisher is now reviving his plans for reservoir and water system, and also has some hopes of securing the establishment of a race track on 100 acres of land fronting the highway.
