EPOCHAL ACHIEVEMENT

A GES MAY come and go before another achievement so outstanding in the annals of engineering and construction as driving the four great diversion tunnels through the solid rock at Hoover dam site is accomplished.

Frank T. Crowe, through his genius for organization and accomplishment, has forced the excavation of those stupendous bores in approximately half the time the work was expected to require.

It is said that Frank Crowe will have a birthday next October 12, and that he expects on that day to force the Colorado river out of the rockbound channel it has occupied for countless centuries, through two of those great 50-foot tunnels so that the real work of building the dam can begin. That will be an accomplishment worthy of any man's

Once the great river is captured and turned aside, the work of removing the debris from the river bed for a depth of 130 to 150 feet up and down stream will begin.

There we will find another outstanding work. An excavation will be made approximately large enough to engulf a ten story building 250 feet wide and 650 feet long below the normal level of the river's surface.

Which would be some hole in any kind of formation. But since this excavation must be made through gravel, rocks and quickand saturated with water, the difficulties of the work become more apparent.

THE CRUCIAL TIME

TUST now is the time to which engineers considering the construction of Hoover dam looked forward with real concern. The high water period occurring while the diversion tunnels still are uncompleted and under construction, was feared as a serious menace to the work and, possibly, the means of great loss and damage to the contractors.

Now, so well have the plans been carried out and so complete are the precautionary measures, there is no fear of danger. Great barriers of reinforced concrete have been erected about the portals of each of the tunnels, dams of no small proportions, so that there is little or no danger of any flood being able to break its way into the tunnels.

We see the problems which for several years appeared so serious, now readily solved by the engineers. Which proves that anything may be accomplished if there is enough money available.
