COLORADO BREAKS LEVEE NEAR **BLYTHE**; THREATENS RANCHES

BLYTHE, Calif., May 31. (U.P.) -Scores of volunteers worked in swirling waters of the Colorado river tonight to repair a wide break n a levee which threatened to flood 20,000 acres of farmlands and nomes of more than 2,500 persons. A farmer discovered the 12-foo gap at Browns Heading, six miles more than 100 workers The river was swollen to its highest stage northeast of here, and summoned since 1921 by recent heavy rains. A nearby road camp sent equip-

ment to aid in placing sandbags along the broken levee. Other workers attempted to divert the flow from an abandoned canal which led directly to the farmlands. The canal was receiving the flow of water through the break. Repair leaders said they hoped to stem the gap before morning.
