## WHO DID THE KILLING?

THE MURDER of Santini and Santini's pal, Vittorio Decimo, present two enticing problems to the peace officers. There are plenty of people in Las Vegas who think they know who the murderer is, assuming that both men were killed by the same party.

It seems a little bit uncanny that, in a case which has attracted so much attention and in which so many people think they know just who did the killing, no arrests whatever have been made.

Placing some of these "suspects" in the county jail might, very likely would, forestall some more killings. In this racketeering business, it seems, life is just one thing after another (while it lasts).

Nevertheless, it is not a pleasant commentary upon our state of law and order that such killings can be carried out without fear of punishment.

### ENCOURAGING

CONGRESS is making mighty efforts to pass the relief bills, revenue bills and economy bills without further delay.

It is not so simple a matter, however. Assuming that every one of the 435 members of the house of representatives and the 96 senators are all perfectly sincere, honest and without any self interest to guide them, it still would be a difficult and tedious task to pass such legislation as is now deired.

Each man has views which differ in some details at least from all the others. Each man must necessarily give up a part of his opinion, concede something of his interests to bring about legislation. Not a single member in all of congress will find the legislation as finally passed entirely to his liking.

It is not necessary or desirable that the members should all think alike. In fact, this diversity of opinion is the thing whch generally guides out policies into grooves of safety.

This comment is brought about by hearing some people roundly abusing congress for inaction. The truth is that the past months have been a period of intense activity shaping policies which the committees have presented to congress along with a vast amount of information collected during the hearings. Such are necessary preliminaries to intelligent legislation.
