BERLIN, June 1 (U.2)-Lieut. Col. peared destined to meet an early defeat in the Reichstag. The Papen government will be

tolerated by the nationalists and Fascists, but the Catholic center party announced it would oppose the new regime because it is an inadequate solution of the crisis caused by resignation of Chancellor Heinrich Bruening. Bruening is the Catholic party leader. Colonel von Papen is a member of the party's extreme right wing.

As a result, the new cabinet may be defeated at an early date. The Reichstag probably will be dissolved and new general elections held

in July or August. The Fascist party or Adolph Hitler, which renewed its riotous demonstrations in the streets during the political negotiations today, expected to come into complete pow-

er as a result of the new elections. The new government is made up chiefly of aristrocrats with a strong military representation. President Paul von Hindenburg approved the list of ministers when it was presented by the chancellor-designate
