HOOVER COURAGE

PRESIDENT HOOVER'S appearance before the senate to urge prompt action on the revenue and economy legislation was another of the heroic things he has done in the face of bitter misrepresentation and

The easy way, obviously, would be to allow things to drift into further confusion and then attempt to put the blame where it belongs. But that is not the Hoover way.

With a courage which has not often before been shown in the presidential office. Herbert Hoover appeared before his most bitter political enemies and clearly and concisely outlined the policies he believes best.

The President's appeal for non-partisan consideration of the proposed measures met with prompt response on the part of a large proportion of the Democratic leaders. The revenue bill was passed before adjournment and the so-called economy bill immediately taken up on the floor of the senate.

Which does not necessarily mean that there is no difference of opinion in the senate between the two major parties. But it does mean that in both parties are men great enough to forget, for the moment at least, their differences of opinion and consider the greater question of the interest of the

It does not mean that Democrats will refrain from criticizing the President's policy when the campaign comes on. That is reasonable and, if we are to maintain our form of government, necessary.

But it does mean, we believe, that the campaign will be fought out on policies and not entirely on personalities.

LATERAL SEWER DISTRICT

THERE IS some misunderstanding, apparently, as to the time and manner in which property owners must pay the assessments against their property.

The payments may be made in cash, if the property owner so desires, within 50 days of the date the assessment is advertised.

Or, if the property owner prefers, as most of them do, the assessment may be allowed to "go to bond," which means that the amount may be paid in ten equal annual installments the same as other taxes are paid.

It is entirely optional with the property owners which method he shall adopt. If he prefers to have ten years' time, all right, although in the latter event he will have to pay interest on the deferred payments.

It seems much easier generally to pay in installments. In which case, we have the use of the improvement and enjoy all its advantages long before we have it all paid for.

One very important advantage we will enjoy by carrying the lateral sewer project to completion now. That is a much lower cost of construction than we can hope for again in many years.
