VON PAPEN AT GERMAN HELM

BERLIN, June 2. (U.P.)—Chancellor Franz von Papen and his cabinet of aristocrats swore allegiance to the Republican constitution tonight and—with "a heavy heart"—took command of the German government.
"I accepted appointment as Chancellor on the appeal of President Hindenburg, but with a heavy heart," said Colonel von Papen at the conclusion of the first cabinet meeting, which was chiefly a formality.
"That is not so much because of the work and worries involved, but especially because it meant replacing a man (referring to Chancellor Heinrich Brüning) with whom I feel myself connected closely."
Wearing a Prince Albert, with a decoration awarded by the exiled kaiser in his lapel, Colonel von Papen later received 100 foreign newspaper men at the chancellery.
"We must have a clear foundation at home for continuing the German foreign policy from the point to which the former government carried it," the chancellor said.
