



2 tablespoons sugar 2 tablespoons grated orange rind

3 tablespeons fat About 2-3 cup milk.

Sift the dry ingredients, add the orange rind and fat and mix well with the tips of the fingers. Make a well in the mixture and add the milk slowly and stir from the center with a fork, until a medium soft dough is formed. Toss on to a lightly floured board and knead few seconds until smooth. Press into a sheet about 12-inch thick, with the palm of the hand. Cut into rounds and cover the top of the biscuits with a mixture of 1 tablepoon of grated orange rind and 1 tablespoon of sugar. Bake in a hot oven (400° F.) about 15 minutes or


