per, pile the hot stuffing in lightly and sew the edges together. Rub salt, pepper, and flour over the outside. Place the roast on a rack in an open pan without water. Sear for 30 minutes in a hot oven (400° F.). Reduce the oven to moderate temperature (300° F.) and cook the meat at this temperature until tender—from 2 1/2 to 3 hours at these oven temperatures. Serve hot with brown gravy.

Orange Biscuits
2 cups sifted soft-wheat flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons grated orange rind
3 tablespoons fat
About 2-3 cup milk.
