ECONOMY BILL CONGRESS last night passed the omnibus economy bill by which something like one hundred and fifty million dollars will be cut from the cost of the government.

The treasury department recommended that 238 million dollars be cut from governmental expenses, but by eliminating all cuts aimed at the veterans' activities and also by putting into effect President Hoover's plan for enforced furloughs as a substitute for the straight cut of ten per cent in salaries, the proposed reductions are cut from 238 millions to about 150 million.

The bill now goes back to the house and after that to the conference committee for settlement of any remaining differences between the two houses.

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

By OTTO E. STRUM (United Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, June 8. (U.P.)—Wall Street lost its rose-colored glasses today when a run of disquieting news from Washington and several pessimistic business reports sent the stock market down 1 to 3 points, many leading issues breaking through their previous "bear market" lows.

Looking upon most of the relief measures before congress now as "pork barrels," traders displayed their dissatisfaction at passage of the two billion dollar Garner relief bill by selling stocks steadily throughout the session.

The situation was not helped by the senate banking committee's approval of the Wagner relief bill, involving a \$500,000,000 bond issue. The Garner bill necessitates issuance of a billion dollars of railroad bonds and Wall Street was not elated at the prospect of the investment markets being glutted with these flotations.

A drop in steel production to 20 per cent of capacity was the final straw. In the day's decline American Telephone broke to below 43, a new low, while Steel common sold off to 25 1/4, equalling the lowest price it has touched since 1907.

Other motors were lower because of the prospect of increased competition as a result of the Auburn price cut. General Motors closed at 3 1/4, off 1/8, and Chrysler at 3 1/2, off 1/8.

Utility and railroad stocks slumped sharply. Consolidated Gas North American and Public Service lost 1 to 3 points in the former category, while among the rails Aichison dropped 2 points, C. & O. 1 1/2 points, Central 1 1/2, Pennsylvania 3/4 and Union Pacific 2 1/2.

Bonds were lower except for higher grades. Wheat dropped more than a cent a bushel to new lows for the season, while cotton sold off 50 cents a bale. The dollar was steady again.
