

NEW CONFESSION MADE BY COUPLE

LOS ANGELES, June 8. (AP)—A second alleged confession of the slaying of a three-year-old Japanese girl was in the hands of authorities today as J. Hatamoto, alias H. Kogi, 39, and Mrs. Ayako Kanda, 31, mother of the dead child, begged

the death penalty for the crime. Police said that after hours of questioning, Kogi recanted his earlier confession that Molly Kanda, the baby victim, had died in a gas suicide pact he planned with Mrs. Kanda to "wipe out our sin." The gas failed to kill them as they desired, he said. The new confession, according to police, said that the child was slain by a rifle bullet fired by Kogi.

MEXICAN SAID TO BE GARCIA

Positive identification of the Mexican house-breaker who was slain Sunday when he attempted to escape from citizens who captured him, was made yesterday when the Bureau of Identification at Sacramento advised the Vegas police department that the fingerprints of the dead man were those of Jose Garcia, arrested here in 1930 for petty larceny and with a record in Salt Lake City and Ogden, Utah.
