THE CONVENTION

THE AMERICAN Legion convention is now entering upon its second day of activities. There seems to be a goodly number in attendance and they appear to be having a good time.

Today they will enjoy an experience that will come to but few, either here and now, or anywhere in the world at any time.

They will drive in automobiles through the great diversion tunnel No. 1 at Hoover dam, through which a portion of the great river will flow for two or three years while the dam is building. And which, after the dam is completed, will be used as a power tunnel to convey the water under pressure of a head of four or five hundred feet, to the giant turbines which will generate electricity to turn the wheels of the west.

Twelve great units will be operated through the two power tunnels, with the capacity of producing one million two hundred thousand horsepower of electrical energy, the greatest and the cheapest power in the world.

You will be interested to know that Nevada has the right to take of that power for operation of industries within the state, more than 125,000 horsepower of electrical energy. Sufficient, if put to work, to more than double the assessed valuation of the state and to increase its population to perhaps two or three times its present number.

So, when, ten years from now, you young men of the Legion, come to Las Vegas to engage in business or establish industries dependent upon this great power, you may recall almost as a dream, that one day in June, 1932, you drove in your automobiles through that great tunnel which, later filled with water and submerged hundreds of feet below the surface of Lake Mead, makes it possible to build Las Vegas into an important industrial city.

ANOTHER CONVENTION

THE NATIONAL Republican convention next Tuesday will begin its sessions in Chicago.

There is but little prospect of any serious contest except on the subject of prohibition.

It is contended that prohibition has no proper place in the platform of either party. Be that as it may, the people expect some clear and concise statement of thoughts and policies.

At the Nevada Republican state convention in Reno, the writer gave some serious thought to the nature of a plank which might be inserted in the national platform.

There is just one way of modifying or repealing the eighteenth amendment. That is in the same manner in which it was adopted and ratified.

The Editor of The Age, by the process of elimination, arrived at the following as the brief, sane and sensible way of framing the plank on the prohibition question. If the opportunity offers, this plank may be proposed before the committee on platform and resolutions at Chicago next week:

"WHEREAS, the subject of prohibition as embodied in the Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, continues to be a subject of contention; and

"WHEREAS, a large proportion of the people of the United States believe that said Eighteenth Amendment was submitted to the states for ratification under such conditions that a fair expression of opinion was not possible and that ratification was had under such pressure of events as to prevent

the reflection of the true sentiment of the majority of the voters; now therefore,

"BE IT RESOLVED, that this convention go on record as favoring such action by congress as will permit the several states of the Union to again express their will on the subject on prohibition."
