DIDN'T MISS HIS EAR UNTIL IT WAS HANDED TO HIM

Facing a maximum penalty of fourteen years in the state penitentiary if they are convicted of mayhem, LeRoy Shuey and his brother Glenn were brought before Judge Frank M. Ryan for their preliminary hearing yesterday afternoon.

Harry Bauer, of the Sunset Inn, eight miles out on the Boulder highway, charges that a fight at the inn the morning of June 4 ended with an ear missing from the left side of his head, and also insists that said ear was bitten off by Glenn Shuey.

Assistant prosecuting attorney Roger Foley placed Bauer on the stand as the first witness in the inquiry, and deft questioning brought out the story of an alleged attack in which both men fell to the ground. Bauer then said that he felt a sensation "like cutting with a razor," but that he didn't know of the loss of his ear until "my wife handed it to me."

Dr. R. D. Balcom, in testifying as to the injury, created a minor sensation when he produced the ear in court, neatly preserved in alcohol.

The inquiry continued through the afternoon, and will in all probability be completed today.

Conviction on a charge of mayhem bears, according to Nevada law, a maximum penalty of fourteen years, though the presiding judge at the trial fixes the minimum penalty.

MINING CLAIMS FREED OF WORK BY RESOLUTION

Providing for suspension of annual assessment work on mining claims held by location in the United States and Alaska, the resolution passed by congress that:

"The provision of section 2324 of

the Revised Statutes of the States which requires on mining claim located, and until a has been issued therefor, not than \$100 worth of labor to be formed, or improvements aggregating such amount to be made year, be, and the same is suspended as to all mining in the United States, and Alaska, during the fiscal year July 1, 1931, to July 1, 1932."

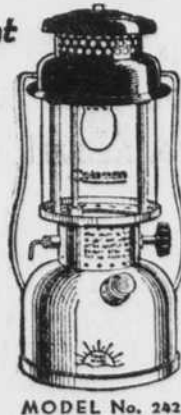
