McFADDEN HITS HOOVER AGAIN

WASHINGTON, June 11 (UP)—
Already shorn of his patronage
privileges for one scorching attack
upon the President, Rep. Louis T.
McFadden, Rep., today severely
criticized Mr. Hoover in connection
with the collapse of the huge
Kreuger-Toll company.
McFadden spoke for half an hour
attacking the federal reserve board
as "one of the most corrupt institu-
tions in the world" and then in-
serted the remainder of his 39-page
speech in the Congressional Record.
"This done, McFadden immedi-
ately sent copies to the press gallery.
