MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK, June 16, (UP) - Wall
street expressed its satisfaction with
the current run of news from Wash-
ington by bidding the stock market
up further today. Selling was en-
countered on the rise, however, and
many of the gains were eradicated,
with the result that the close was
irregular.

Bonds also were strong when the
financial community interpreted the
house's vote on the bonus bill as
assuring ultimate defeat of the
measure.

Commodities found themselves
about unchanged, wheat losing an
early rise of a cent a bushel and
cotton holding steady around the
previous levels throughout the ses-
sion.

Railroad stocks assumed leader-
ship and managed to hold a good
part of their gains in the late re-
action. Union Pacific, New York
Central, Atchafon, Baltimore &
Ohio, Chesapeake & Ohio and other
leaders chugged up 1 to 2 points,
later easing off somewhat from the
highs, but closing with gains of
fractions to more than a point.

Steel, American Telephone, Amer-
ican Can and other market top-
notchers opened about unchanged,
sold off slightly, recovered some-
what more than that and then dip-
ped again to close with fractional
losses. Auburn Auto ran up to a
high of 77 1/2, dropped to 70 1/2 and
closed at 71 1/2, off 1 1/2.

The two king-pins of the electri-
cal manufacturing group, General
Electric and Westinghouse, were
firm spots in the industrial divi-
sion, closing with fractional gains.
J. I. Case was subject to profit-
taking after an early rise to 27 1/2
and closed at 25 1/2, off 1 1/2.

National Biscuit and Homestake
Mining attracted mild attention, the
former gaining a point, the latter
more than four. Oil stocks gave a
very good account, supported on
the improved statistical position of
the industry.

Public utility stocks moved irregu-
larly in a narrow range. This was
illustrated by such closing prices
as Consolidated Gas 39 1/2, off 1/2;
Standard Gas, 11 1/2, off 1/2; Public
Service, 36, up 1/2; North Ameri-
can, 19 1/2, up 6, and Columbia Gas,
7 1/2, unchanged.
