straggled back to the camp. One veteran sat atop a shack singing through a megaphone and a large group was gathered about him.

Throughout the day reinforcements filtered into the capitol grounds until 5,000 men were present.

Brig. Gen. Pelham D. Glassford, United States army retired, chief of police, had predicted there would be no trouble after the vote.

He kept out of sight himself and sent Inspector Alfred J. Headley to handle the 10,000 men. They dispersed quickly.

Commander-in-Chief Walter Waters made his way through the hundreds jammed on the capitol steps and addressed his men in a voice hoarse from shouting all day.

"The bill is beaten," he said. "We have had a temporary setback.

"But we are here to stay, and I have told them in there (the capitol) that we will stick it out. We are going to get more men as fast as we can and stay here until we change the minds of these men."

"Take it on the chin like Americans and fight it out. We're disappointed but we're not discouraged."

"The result doesn't alter our plan to stay here until we get results, and to get more, and more, and more men to join us. Some of them are on the way now and others will come."

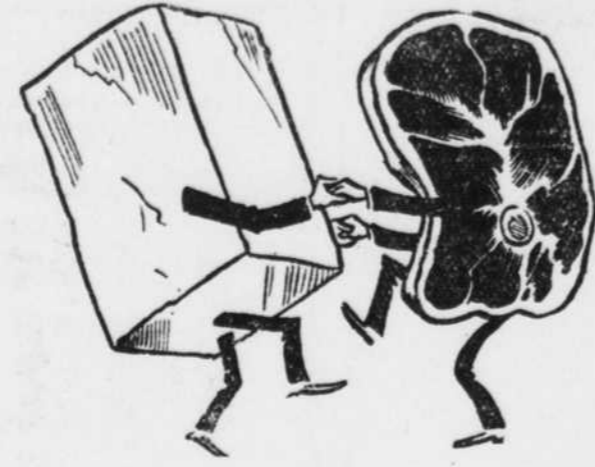

Scott B. McCarthy, commander of the Anacostia camp from which the march on the capitol originated, denied that leaders had instigated the movement. He said:

"We did not order the movement. The men went entirely on their own initiative and as American citizens. They were not offered nor was it a planned movement. As long as they continue to conduct themselves in orderly fashion they have a perfect right to do what they did."
