## BOATSWAIN MADE DERBY FAVORITE

CHICAGO, June 17. (AP) — The \$50,000 American derby, which has been packed with turf drama since it was first run way back in 1894 will bring together a field of fourteen 3-year-olds for its 24th renewal tomorrow at Washington park.

Boatswain, son of Man O' War and winner of the Withers mile at Belmont park, was made the overnight favorite at odds of 5-2. The eastern colt, owned by Walter M. Jeffords of New York, will carry top weight of 126 pounds. All others will carry 118 pounds, except the filly, I Say, which has been assigned 113 pounds.

Stepenfehitch, owned by Mrs. John Hay Whitney, was second choice at 4-1, and Osculator, owned by W. R. Coe, third at 6-1.
