



### INTEREST IN STRIKE GROWS

Prospector's picks and magnify-ing glasses seem to be the order of day in the Goldrange district In the past week cars of all kinds have been rolling into the new mining camp. Incidentally, Goldrange is the only new gold discovery camp the present time in Nevada. Two shafts are at present vieing with each other for the daily sinking records, while two more are contracted for the near future. The officials in charge are issuing a timely warning to unemployed miners, that there are no jobs open at the present time in the new camp.

Several eminont geologists have pronounced Goldrange the most promising mineralized area discov ered in the last decade. When asked why this sensational field, right in the back yard of Las Vegas, had not been exploited before, Louis Cramer, geologist and president of Goldrange Standard Mining Co., stated that the values in place are deeper than shallow prospecting would uncover, which makes it necessary for a development plan necessitating the sinking of a shaft to the depth of at least 200 feet. The general trend of the vein system runs north and south, while the cross veins run east and west.

Old-timers will be surprised to learn that the reason no color showed in their pans during the panning process was due to the fact that the highly oxidized iron condition of the ore prevented the fine par-ticles of gold from showing. The same ore showed high values when milled or assayed. In answer to numerous inquiries anent the sale of the townsite lots, Charles F. #### **OLYMPIC MARK BROKEN ON** COAST

PATTERSON STADIUM, LOS ANGELES, June 18 (U.P.)-Athletes of the southern California area served notice on the nation today that they must be strongly considered in the Olympics games west-ern trials at Long Beach July 1 and

Approximately 200 athletes, representing leading athletic organizations, universities and others running unattached, participated in a meet that saw the breaking of five existing Olympic marks, and the equalling of one world's record.

Frank Wykoff, flash from U. S. C., bettered the Olympic games record in the 100-meter run and equalled the world's record in that event, when he nosed out Hec Dyer of the Los Angeles Athletic club to win in 10.4 seconds. The present world's record is neld jointly by Charles Paddock and Eddle Tolan. The meet brought together two

former foes on intercollegiate tracks. Wykon and Dyer, tormerly of Stanford, now of the L. A. A. C. wygon bested Lyer in the mais of the 100 meter run after both nad won trial heats to quality. Then Dyer came back to win the 200 meter run in 21.4, bettering by two-tenths of a second the record held by Percy Williams of Canada.

Jimmy Payne of U. S. C. approacned the world's mark of 14.4 second in the 110 meter high hurdles within one-tenth of a second. His time of 14.5 seconds bettered the existing Olympic record of 14.6 seconds held by Atkinson of South
