MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK, June 22 (UP)-Stocks
failed to arouse any enthusiasm in
Wall street today, plodding through
another dull session and closing ir-
regularly after many of the leaders
had drifted down to the lowest
prices in years.
A rally in the wheat pit after
that grain had established new lows
for the season furnished about the
only reason for a spotted rise in
stocks late in the day. Wheat re-
covered all of a loss of a cent a
bushel and closed slightly higher
when reports from the northwest
suggested damage to the crop from
grasshoppers.
Other commodities steadied up
near the close, cotton regaining
about half an early loss of 50 cents
a bale. The bond market was an
apathetic affair and prices drifted
irregularly in a narrow range. For-
eign currencies advanced against
the dollar.
Steel common and preferred were
sold plenty as a result of the week-
ly "Iron Age" report of operations
at 16 per cent, against 18 per cent
last week. The preferred made a

new low since 1904 at 59, while
common touched 24, the lowest
price it has sold at since 1907.
American Telephone and Ameri-
can Can also were called upon to
"take it," the former chalking up
a new record low of 7 3/4, off 1 1/2,
and the latter selling down to 32 1/2,
a new low for the present shares.
Partial recoveries were scored be-
fore the close, but they were unim-
pressive looking for better things
in stocks.
The general list suffered more
from a lack of buyers than any
particular selling pressure, that
body now has the trading element
remaining decidedly on the side-
lines and indicating it intended to
do so pending some definite devel-
opments in the general situation.
The American Petroleum Insti-
tute's weekly report showed a gain
in crude oil output, but a big drop
in stocks of motor fuel, so, on the
whole, it was favorably construed.
Oil stocks were fairly steady, al-
though Standard of New Jersey
closed slightly lower at 24 1/2.
Auburn Auto ranged between a
high of 54 1/2 and a low of 51 1/2,
and closed at 53 1/2, off 2 1/2. Other
motor stocks were very dull but
steady, Chrysler and General Mot-
ors closing with small gains.
Railroad stocks were quiet and
showed about an even mixture of
fractional gains and losses when
the final gong rang.
