utes later said he would stand pat. Smith vehemently denied reports circulated here that he would withdraw his presidential candidacy if Roosevelt, once his close friend, would retire from the contest. He is still in the race—and to fight every inch of the way.

One after another, various "favorite sons" attacked the Roosevelt leaders—former Senator James A. Reed of Missouri; Governor Murray; Rep. Sam Fayburn of Texas, manager of Speaker of the House Garner's campaign; William Gibbs McAdoo, sponsor of Garner's campaign.

Farley insisted today that Roosevelt has between 690 and 700 votes.

The Roosevelt chairman of the rules committee, Bruce Kremer of Montana, predicted they were sure to win in their fight to upset the traditional rule for nominations. It's not a question of "expediency," he said, but of "courage to do away with something that has outgrown its usefulness."

**"SOFT" ANSWER**

The Roosevelt people gave "the soft answer" to the Hague attack on their candidate in a statement by James W. Gerard of New York, former ambassador to Germany and until a few months ago treasurer of the national committee.

Denying the charge that Roosevelt could not carry the east, Gerard said "anyone of the Democrats who have projected their headquarters into the ring can carry New York on a platform sincerely and undoubtedly wet.

**'REAL' BOGUS COINS LATEST**

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 24 (U.P.)—The newest by-product of the depression in this section is "genuine" counterfeit coins.

Twenty-five cent pieces, containing more — not less — silver than government coins, were reported today by half a dozen mercantile concerns.

HOLLYWOOD, June 24 (U.P.)—Lee Ramage, promising young San Diego heavyweight, continued his string of recent victories tonight with a technical knockout over Tony Poloni, San Francisco state light heavyweight champion, in the fifth round of their main event at Hollywood Legion stadium.

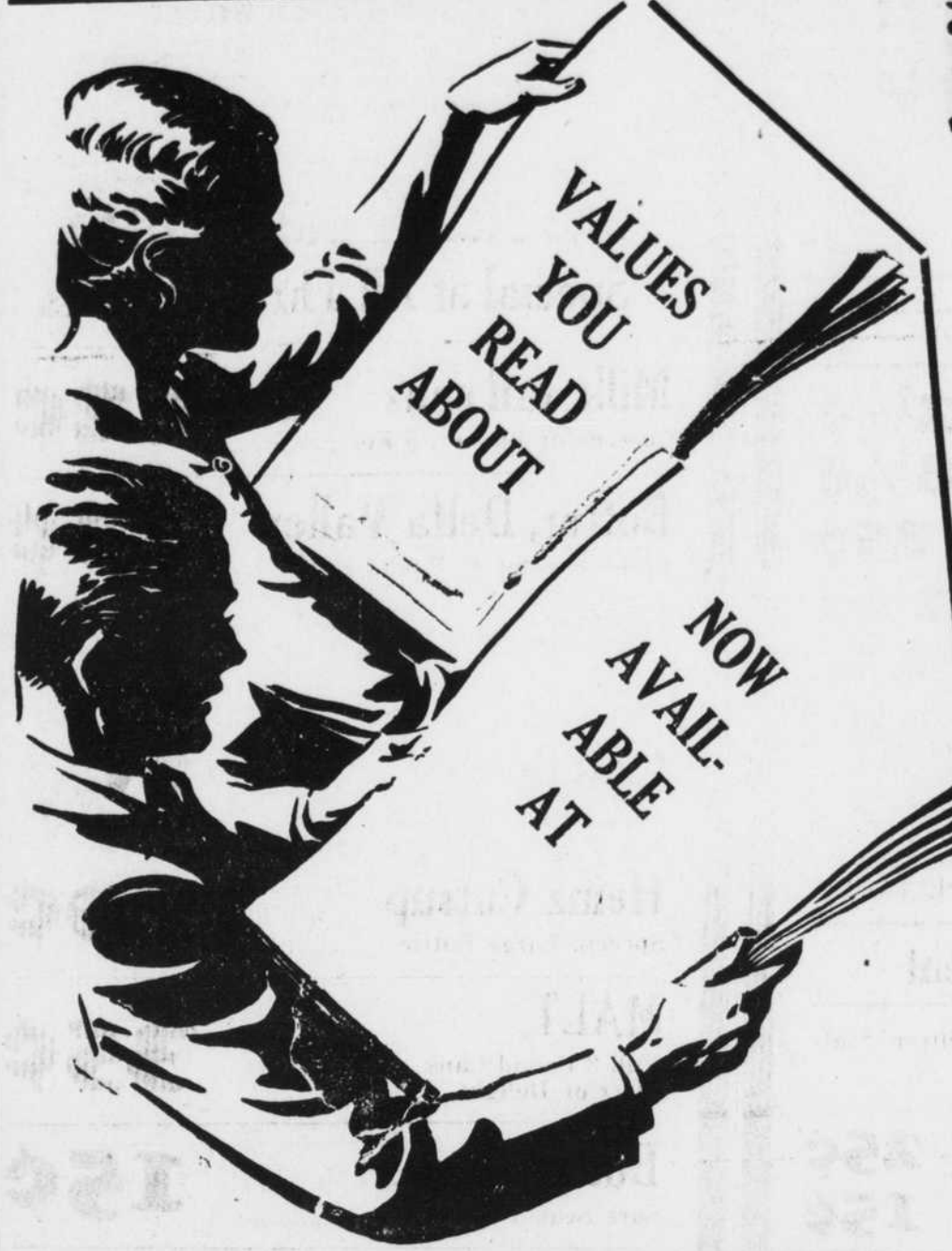
