STATION HERE

Las Vegas' newest super-service station at Fifth and Fremont streets is so rapidly nearing completion that the day-by-day obsolescence being made by Hampton Brothers, contractors for the job.

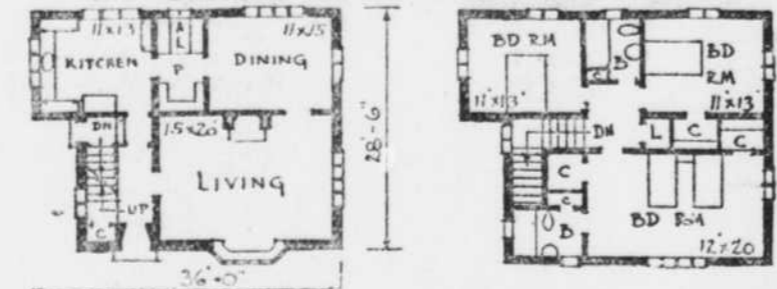
The building permit for the new station, a unit of Standard Stations, Inc., was issued just 20 days ago, to the contractors and calls for buildings of brick and concrete construction, valued at in excess of \$7,500.

The construction involves the building of the gas and oil service station proper, as well as a tire, battery and greasing service building at the rear of the lot.

All the equipment for the new super-service station will be the most modern and efficient that can be secured today, while the wide range of Standard products that will be offered will equal any station in the southwest, according to present plans of Standard Stations, Inc.

This little home might have come straight out of an English village.

Hand-adzed timbers are used for the frames of the metal casement windows and the roof is of cedar shingles laid with a slight irregularity. The stucco of the walls is given only a slightly textured finish.

Every room in the house has a corner situation. Entering through a doorway which is set into the house wall, we find ourselves in a small hall with the stairway to the second floor on our left and the doorway to the living room at the right. The living room is almost square, and is well lighted from a range of casement windows at one end and a large bay window looking toward the roadway.

In the wall opposite the bay window is the fireplace, and at the right of this is the door which provides access to the dining room. Between dining room and kitchen is a combination butler's pantry and dining alcove.

The second story projects slightly, and the bay window which is the principal feature of the front facade juts out beyond the wall until it meets the overhang of the upper story. On the second floor three good-sized bedrooms and two baths have been provided.

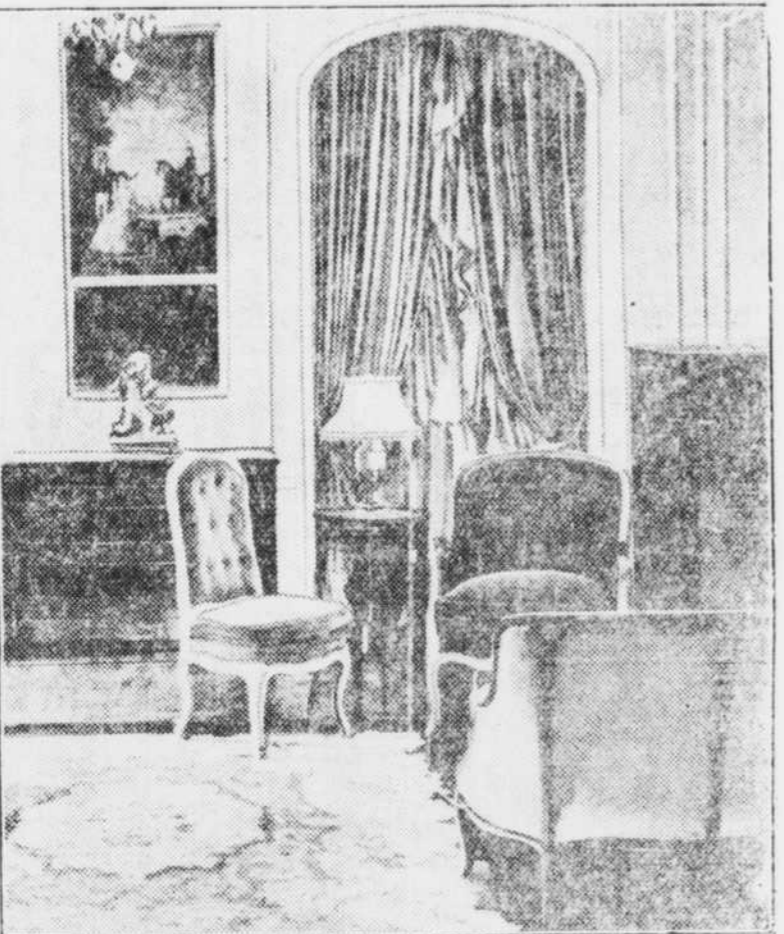
Approximate cost of erecting this house will be between \$8,000 and \$10,000, according to material and labor costs.

For milady's boudoir or her intimate sitting room there is a revival of interest in furniture of French period styles.

The formal arrangement of the French "golden age" is easily modified to meet the informality of present day living. Furniture is placed in convenient groupings, and there is no need for the stool-like chairs which prudently were used by ancient ladies whose costumes included billowy hoopskirts.

Cedar, chestnut, ebony and exotic woods are favored. Fabrics are damask, velvet, leather and needlework in strong colors. Marquetry, lacquer, gilding, painting and metal mountings are used for accent. Delicate colors are permissible, and several pieces may be upholstered to match.

Light Persian carpets are popular as consonant floor coverings. For lighting, a chandelier with plenty of delicate crystal pendants is favored. Stand lamps are in the mode of the period. Walls are paneled in painted cream, beige, soft yellow or very light gray.
