CIRCLES SHAPE CONVICT FATES



If State Auditor John Brandon, member of Alabama's pardon board, marks a closed circle on a prisoner's parole application it indicates his denial, but a broken circle may give the prisoner another chance. Brandon has acted on more than 3,000 applications since 1927.

MONTGOMERY, Ala., June 29. —A quarter turn of State Auditor John Brandon's pen has aided in opening a figurative iron gate of Kilby prison to more than 1,000 state convicts.

Serving his sixth year on Alabama's three-man pardon board, Brandon retains an orthographic eccentricity understood by only a few state employes and newspapermen.

CIRCLES SHOW HIS VERDICT
When an application for parole reaches his desk, it is carefully read, the prison record studied and marks of the trial judge and prosecutor noted.

If his decision is for a denial, Mr. Brandon draws a circle on the application and writes the date.

GAP MEANS NEW CHANGE

However, if the case has merit and "another change" is in order, the state auditor starts the circle but turns his pen inward just before reaching the starting point, leaving a tiny opening in the circle.
