

PLACES SWAPPED AGAIN AS CARDS CLIMB TO 4TH AFTER NOSING OUT REDS, 10 TO 9

NEW YORK, June 29. (AP)—The St. Louis Cardinals replaced the Phillies in fourth place in the National League today by nosing out the Cincinnati Reds, 10 to 9, as the Phillies dropped into a fifth place tie with the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Rallies featured the play of both the Cards and Reds. St. Louis got six runs in the eighth inning, after Cincinnati had made five in the seventh. The Reds made a fighting finish with four more tallies in the ninth, but Gilbert lined into a double play in that frame with the bases loaded to cut the Reds' rally too short to be effective.

The Reds found Lindsey, Stout, Derringer and Hallahan for 12 hits, while the Cards pounded Benton, Kolp, and Johnson for 17.

The Dodgers pulled the Phillies down to their level by blanking them 7 to 0. Hack Wilson blasted out his fifteenth home run of the season in the third inning with two Dodgers on base. His teammate, Joe Stripp, hit for the circuit in the fifth. Holl's Thurston held the Phillies to five hits, while three Philadelphia hurriers were found for 13.

These were the only National League games scheduled. The Washington Senators knocked Lefty Gomez, the American League's leading pitcher out of the box, but, despite this, the Senators

lost to the New York Yankees, 6 to 5. Gomez was replaced by Piparas in the eighth when the Senators tied the score, but big George halted the rally, and kept Gomez' 11-game winning streak intact.

The Detroit Tigers strengthened their hold on second place by overwhelming Cleveland's Indians, 13 to 4. The Tigers blasted out 13 hits to score 12 runs in the first five innings. In the fifth, Gehring cracked out a homer to score behind Davis. Earl Averil drove out his fourteenth four-bagger for Cleveland in the eighth with one on.

The St. Louis Browns downed the Chicago White Sox, 6 to 1. Lyons and Evans yielded 11 hits to the Browns, while Hadley and Gray limited Chicago to four safeties.

These were the only games scheduled.

BOULDER CLUB USES NEW AIR COOLING PLAN

Operating at but fifty per cent capacity, without the use of the large rear end intake fan, the Boulder club is one of the coolest spots in Las Vegas, despite the brisen sun beating down upon the city.

According to J. P. Goumond, the plant was installed by the Burgis Air Conditioning company for service early in May, but so efficient was the plant that so far it has been unnecessary to utilize more than half the refrigerating capacity of the cooling system.

It is estimated that at no time will the Boulder club air conditioning and cooling system be taxed to full capacity except in the event of an exceptionally hot summer. Inasmuch as the maximum temperatures of last summer's hot weather were used as guides in estimating the necessary capacity of the Boulder club refrigerating system, it is not expected that any strain will be imposed upon the cooling system by the hottest weather that can occur in Las Vegas.
