**DIRECT STATE RELIEF GRANT IS EXPECTED**

House Gives Approval To Unemployment Relief

WASHINGTON, April 21, (U.P.)—Direct federal aid to hungry and distressed millions throughout the nation moved a step nearer reality late today when the house passed the administration's five hundred million dollar relief bill.

A similar measure already has passed the senate.

The house vote today was 331 to 42.

Although the bill is practically identical to one passed by the senate, the house measure must be re-passed by the upper house because of a parliamentary squabble.

Both bills provide a total of five hundred million dollars in direct federal relief to care for the unemployed. The house bill provides two hundred, fifty million dollars for unrestricted relief grants to states, and a like amount to be matched for state appropriations, before distribution.

The Reconstruction Finance Corporation will provide all funds.
