Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 2:00 p.m., July 30th, 1934 for the construction of a portion of the State Highway System in Clark County between Glendale and Logandale, a length of 6.12 miles.

The minimum wage paid for unskilled labor on this contract shall be \$0.60 per hour and for skilled labor shall be \$0.75 per hour.

The Federal-State Employment Office located at Las Vegas, Nevada, is the local agency designated to prepare the employment lists for this contract.
