## LAS VEGAS Garbage Collection

On August 1, 1934, the City of Las Vegas will take over the handling of the garbage and rubbage disposal in the City. The City department handling this work is anxious to do so at the least possible cost to the people and in order to do this it is going to be necessary that the property owners co-operate to the fullest possible extent. A few of the things which the people will be asked to do follow:

- 1. Collections of both dry and wet garbage will be made in the business district every day starting at 4 a. m. in order to have collections made and the equipment out of the way when morning business deliveries are being made in the business district. It will be necessary for the business places to have the garbage and rubbage in adequate containers available at the time stated above which will mean putting it out at night for early morning collection if the place of business will not be open early enough for collection.
- 2. In the residence district the property owners shall have adequate covered container which must be placed near the alley in order to be handy to the pick-up trucks. In order to cover the city with the force and equipment in use it is essential that the containers be available at the time the trucks make the pick-up. All containers for both wet and dry garbage must be of size and contruction making it possible for handling by not more than two men. No pick-ups of any material will be made from piles on the ground.
- 3. Where there are alleys adjoining the property all pick ups will be made from the alley. Men working th trucks will not be required to walk the length of the lots in order to get containers left at the house.
- 4. All calls for information should be made to A. L. Drew, at the office of the City Clerk between the hours of 11 a. m. and 12 noon each day. The phone is 408.

It is unlawful to burn garbage on any lot or premise within the limits of the City of Las Vegas unless said burning is conducted in a property built sanitary incinerator within a building having a stack sufficiently high to control all odors and without first having had and obtained a permit from the health officer allowing same.
