

POLITICAL NEWS



State politics were warmed up last week with the filing of John A. Cooper and Richard Kirman for governor on the democratic ticket. Both men are from Reno.

From a survey of the state it is quite evident that the people as a whole are through with politicians and bankers. In the northern part of the state some 27,000 people lost every dollar they possessed—at the hands of the bankers—and politicians. It is also quite evident that the people will not now turn their state over to these same factions. What the people do want is a business man—a successful one—for governor of this state. On the democratic ticket we have two men that meet these requirements—John A. Cooper of Reno, and Archie Grant, from Las Vegas. It is high time—after our experiences of the past few years that the operation of the state government be turned back to the people.

Senator Key Pittman has returned to Nevada—and now we find the majority of the "new dealers" hunting a place in which to hide. Senator McCarren appears to be one of the leading lights in the ranks of the "new dealers." Richard Kirman, banker, was drafted by the "new dealers" for governor. In county politics we have an old timer on the democratic ticket for

Justice of the Peace—Tom Carroll. Carroll practiced law for more than ten years before coming to Las Vegas, and is well qualified to hold down the job. It will be interesting to watch this race, with Carroll, Marion Earl, John Russell and Ernest Adams all on the ticket. The two high men on the ticket will have to fight it out at the general election.

Bill Mundy, County Treasurer now has opposition for that office. O. K. Adcock, business man and president of the school board having filed for the office with County Clerk Scott. It will be a hard job for any man to oust Bill Mundy.

For the State Senate, Frank M. Ryan is still unopposed, but we are told that he will have an opponent on the democratic ticket. Ryan knows how to do his politics and will be hard to beat. It is said

that there will also be a republican in the field for that office.

Frank DeVinney, County Assessor, is still keeping his "fingers crossed" and has his eye on everyone that goes up to the county clerk's office. If Frank can get about five minutes with anyone that has the bug to file for his office, we'll bet that he can talk them out of it in that many minutes.

The sheriff's race seems almost at a standstill—no new candidates for the democratic nomination. Sheriff Keate and Clint Boggs seem to head the ticket with Fred Jensen of Boulder City worrying them both.

Saturday at noon is the deadline for candidates to file for office—and then the fun will start in—for thirty days.

Another interesting race will be between Roger Foley and Wm. Scott for the office of district attorney. Both men are well known in the political world.
