It is reported from Elko county that John H. Stratton and eastern associates have been making an examination of placer properties near Tuscorora and have decided to install a plant to work them.

LEAD OUTPUT TAKES DROP

Stocks of refined lead in the United States at the end of June amounted to 238,181 tons, an increase of 4,939 tons over the total on hand a month previous.

Production during June amounted to 33,218 tons, against 39,678 tons in May. Shipments to consumers come to 28,276 tons in June, against 29,316 tons in May. A summary of the latest figures on the position of refined lead as issued by the American Bureau of Metal Statistics follows:

HELLO LEGIONNAIRES



Pageantry, replete with color, thrills and spectacular events will rule in San Francisco during the week of August 11 to 15 when the American Legion, and allied organizations, holds its sixteenth annual convention. Accompanying an important business program the fifty committees under the direction of Carl W. Miles, general chairman, have produced a massive show made up of many scenes and events.

The most important, and spectacular, event of the week will be the monster parade, Monday afternoon, August 13. Thousands of Legionnaires, members of the Auxiliary, the Sons of the American Legion and other veterans will march to the stirring music of more than fourteen great military bands; forty drum and bugle corps

with their martial rhythm, drill units and artistic floats will combine to make this event an inspiring demonstration.

Monday night a great military pageant will be held in Seals Stadium where Legion Post bands and drum and bugle corps will participate in a competition to determine what Legion band and drum corps will represent California at the National American Legion in Miami next October.

In addition there will be numerous sports events, and other activities to entertain the visiting Legionnaires and their families.

Early indications are that more than 40,000 visitors plan to come to San Francisco to participate and witness the events, according to Chairman Miles.

LEASERS ON MOHAWK MINE ARE GETTING GOOD MILL ORE

The Mohawk mine, at Union Basin has been leased and work is being done under the leasehold and good mill ore is being secured. The Mohawk has been one of the old time mines, having been in the hands of James Beauchamp for many years, and wonderful ore having been extracted. This ore ran away up in gold and silver, and was being shipped to the smelter for treatment.

The ore is now rather low in grade, compared with the production of the years gone by, when thousands of dollars in this high grade material were taken from the grass roots section of the property. The mines run up the mountain to the south of the old Goldconda workings and in a most accessible part of the country. It also lies to the south of the old Mexican mine, which is now being operated in the old workings at the top of the divide between Union and Todd Basins. — Mohave Miner.

BUCKSKIN NATIONAL READY TO PRODUCE

RENO, Nev. — Unless present signs go awry, Buckskin National mine in northern Humboldt county, about 60 miles north of Winnemucca, should go on a production basis within the next 60 days, it is learned from an official source. The Lucky Tiger Combination Gold Mining company of Kansas City, which has since 1909 paid its stockholders more than \$11,000,000 in dividends from the operation of its El Tigre mine in the Montezuma district, State of Sonora, Mexico, is again in possession of the Buckskin National mine.

Through its newly organized subsidiary, Nevada Lucky Tiger Mines, Inc., is spending \$160,000 in more fully opening up the proved ore bodies and erecting on the property
