WANTS MORE DISPLAY OF FLAG OF NEVADA

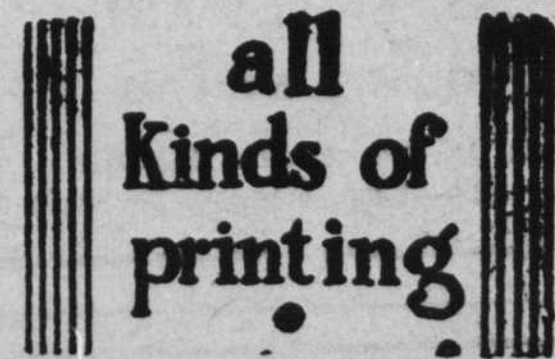
The following letter regarding the state flag of Nevada has been sent to the press of the state by Maurice J. Sullivan, former lieutenant-governor.

"While I was lieutenant-governor, I offered a cash prize for the best design for a new state flag. At that time I pointed out that our state flag was very expensive to make because of the immense amount of detail and the many colors—forty in all. Many designs were submitted, and one selected. In 1929 the legislature created it as the 'official flag of the state of Nevada.'

"Many persons consider ours to be the most beautiful of all state flags. The field is solid cobalt blue. In the upper left-hand quarter is a design consisting of two sprigs of sagebrush, crossed at the stems, forming a half wreath. Above the wreath is a silver star with five points. The word 'Nevada' surrounds the star. Above the star, on a golden scroll, are the words, 'Battle born.'

"It is to be regretted that our flag is not more often displayed and that only about two of the flags are in existence. If one travels in other states, he sees their flags everywhere; on their state, county and city buildings; on schools, banks and other institutions. The 'Bear flaks are in existence. If one travels visits California—it is shown on all occasions. But our flag is never seen. Our celebrations are held without it. It is never carried in parades.

"No one, of course, is to blame for our apathy in this matter, but feeling that the loyal people of our proud state are equally as anxious to see this emblem of our sovereignty as are those of other states, I have recently written the largest manufacturers in the country, and have received their price lists. I shall be pleased to furnish the prices to anyone interested, and to act as a clearing house for orders so that quantity lots may be had at considerable saving."
