Every place you go you hear heated arguments on politics. Out of them all comes the fact that John A. Cooper of Reno is the candidate both of the local aspirants fear for the gubernatorial nomination. The nomination of Fred S. Alward for lieutenant governor is agreed on by all—therefore the north and eastern part of the state contend that they should elect the next governor. Cooper being by far the strongest candidate in that section is the cause of the tremendous swing of supporters to him.

Our county candidates seem to be slowing up a bit—resting for the last and final week's activity.

In last week's issue we had Bill Mundy running against Ward of Boulder City and Dave Farnsworth against Adcock—just a little error on our part—but it doesn't make much difference who Bill and Dave run against as you will find beth way out in the lead when the votes are counted.

Bill Wallace, candidate for sheriff, ask us to remove his card from our paper—because we "did not give him a break." "You knew when you put your political card in the paper, Bill, that we were not for you for sheriff—so why get all hot around the collar?"

The Age is said to be the only paper in the state of Nevada that has taken a definite stand on any of the state candidates—the only paper that has not been "riding the fence until after the votes are counted." Whether we are right or wrong, we believe that it is the DUTY of every paper to voice what it believes to be to the best interests of the people.

That is why we are for the nomination of Fred S. Alward for lieutenant-governor—and why we are for the nomination of John A. Cooper for governor.
