SHIPPING GRADE ORE IS EXPOSED REOPENING MINE

Development of the Clay Peters mine, 14 miles east of Mina, by Goddon and Jay Bettles, is said to be meeting with highly satisfactory results, according to reports from Mina. Recent prospecting of the ground is said to have exposed several veins of good appearance and the Bettles brothers are said to have opened a width of two and a half to three feet of shipping ore.

The Bettles brothers lately sold their interest in a lease and option on the Harvey Taylor mine to Henry Klipstein of California, who is said to have financed them in starting the project. The latter property has been provided with good mining equipment and it was reported that the owners may shortly construct a mill. — Nevada State Journal.

50-TON MILL IS NEARLY FINISHED AT SILVER PEAK

In the Red Mountain section of the Silver Peak district, Esmeralda county, a 50-ton mill is under construction on the Raymond Gordon property, adjoining the Valcalda mine, foundations having been completed and a lighting plant installed. Two miles of 2½-inch pipe to convey water from the Valcalda springs has been ordered. It was reported and application had been made for use of the water and for the right-of-way for the pipe line. J. P. Hart, mining engineer of Tonopah, is manager. — Nevada State Journal.

The partners are still working on the deposit, which was found by Clarence Lucas several months ago. Every pound of the material hoisted out of the hole is shipping ore, and so far there is no sign of a waste deposit about the shaft. Size of the deposit has not been determined as no walls have been found. Assays run from a low of \$40 to a high of several hundred, chiefly in gold. —Goldfield News.
