

BIDS WANTED FOR HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT — NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 3:00 P. M., September 19, 1934, for the construction of an asphaltic roadmix surface on a portion of the State Highway System in Clark and Nye Counties, a length of 22.01 miles, between Indian Springs and 22 Miles West.

The minimum wage paid for labor on this contract shall be as follows: \$0.56 per hour for unskilled labor, \$0.70 per hour for labor, intermediate grade, and \$0.90 per hour for skilled labor.

The Federal State Employment Office located at Las Vegas, Nevada, is the local agency designated to prepare the employment lists for this contract.

The attention of bidders is directed to the special provisions covering subletting or assigning the contract, to the use of domestic materials, and to the waiver of gas tax exemption.

Plans and specifications may be examined at the office of the undersigned; the County Clerk's Offices at Las Vegas and Tonopah; the Highway Department Division Offices at Las Vegas and Reno; and at the District Office of the Bureau of Public Roads, 461 Market Street, San Francisco. Plans, form of proposal, contract and specifications may be secured by prequalified bidders through the office of the undersigned. A deposit of five dollars (\$5.00) is required for each copy of the plans with proposal form, two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) of which will be refunded upon return of the plans in good condition within thirty (30) days after the opening of bids. Bids must be on the proposal form of the Highway Department and must be accompanied by certified check in the amount of five per cent (5%) of bid.
