

ELKO SHEEPMEN TO SELL 60,000 EWES

Elko county sheepmen have listed with the FERA administration 60,000 sheep to be shipped off the ranges of northern Nevada, according to J. D. Yeager, representative of the agricultural adjustment administration, who has just concluded a trip up north.

Nye county sheepmen are preparing to dispose of a large number of woolies, it is reported here. Listings are first filed with the FERA officials, and the sheep purchased after apportionments are made. The government pays \$2. a head

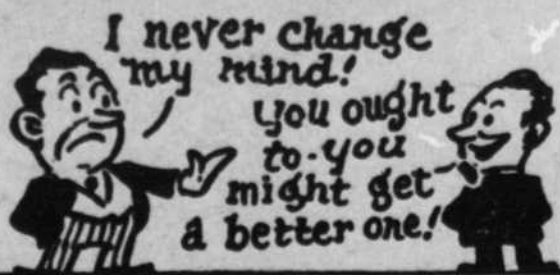
for ewes purchased. Nevada sheepmen are inclined to thin their flocks and relieve congested ranges. Recent rains have improved the winter-feed situation considerably, otherwise sheep sales and shipments would have been general and heavy. —Tonopah Times.

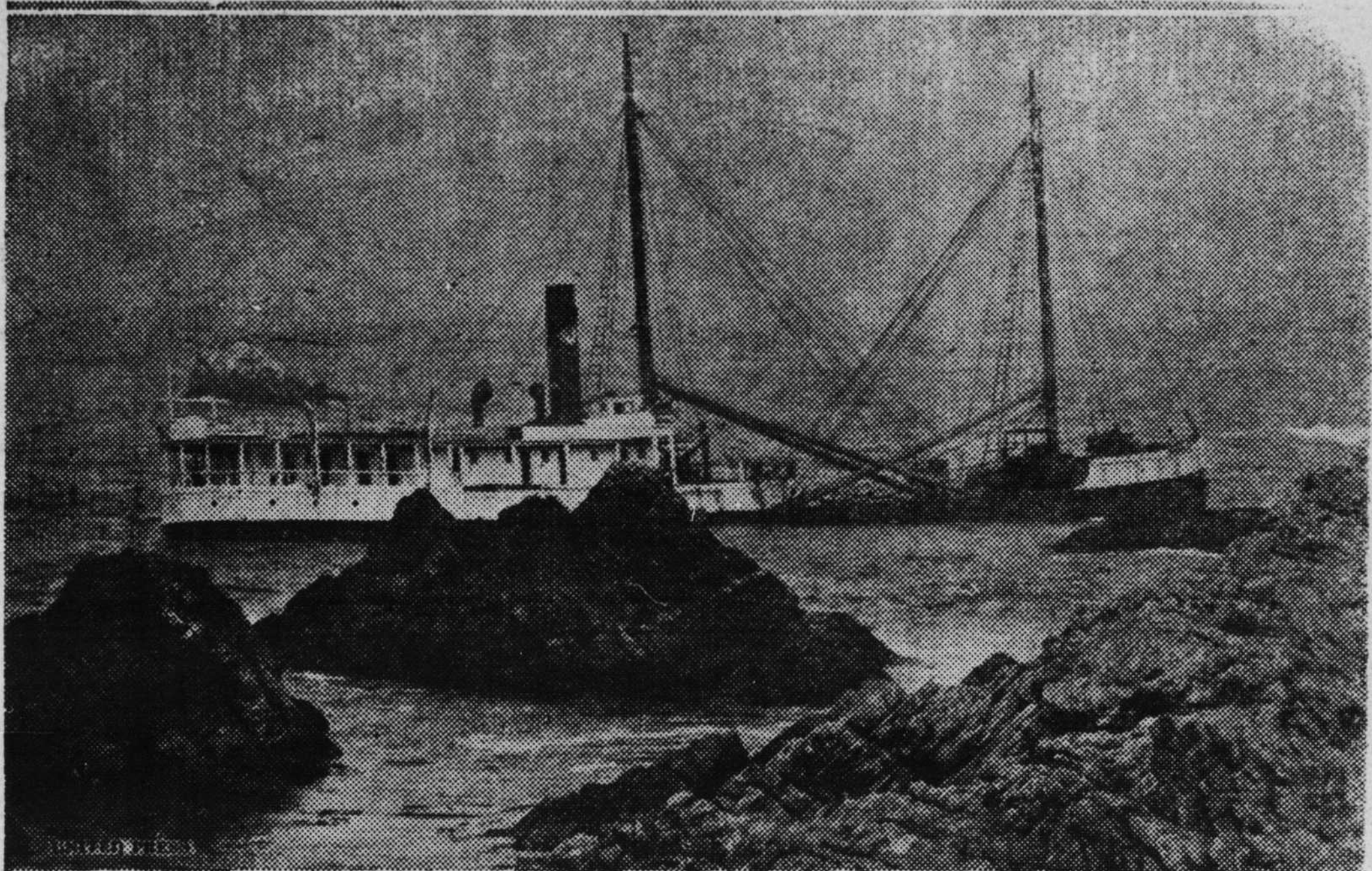

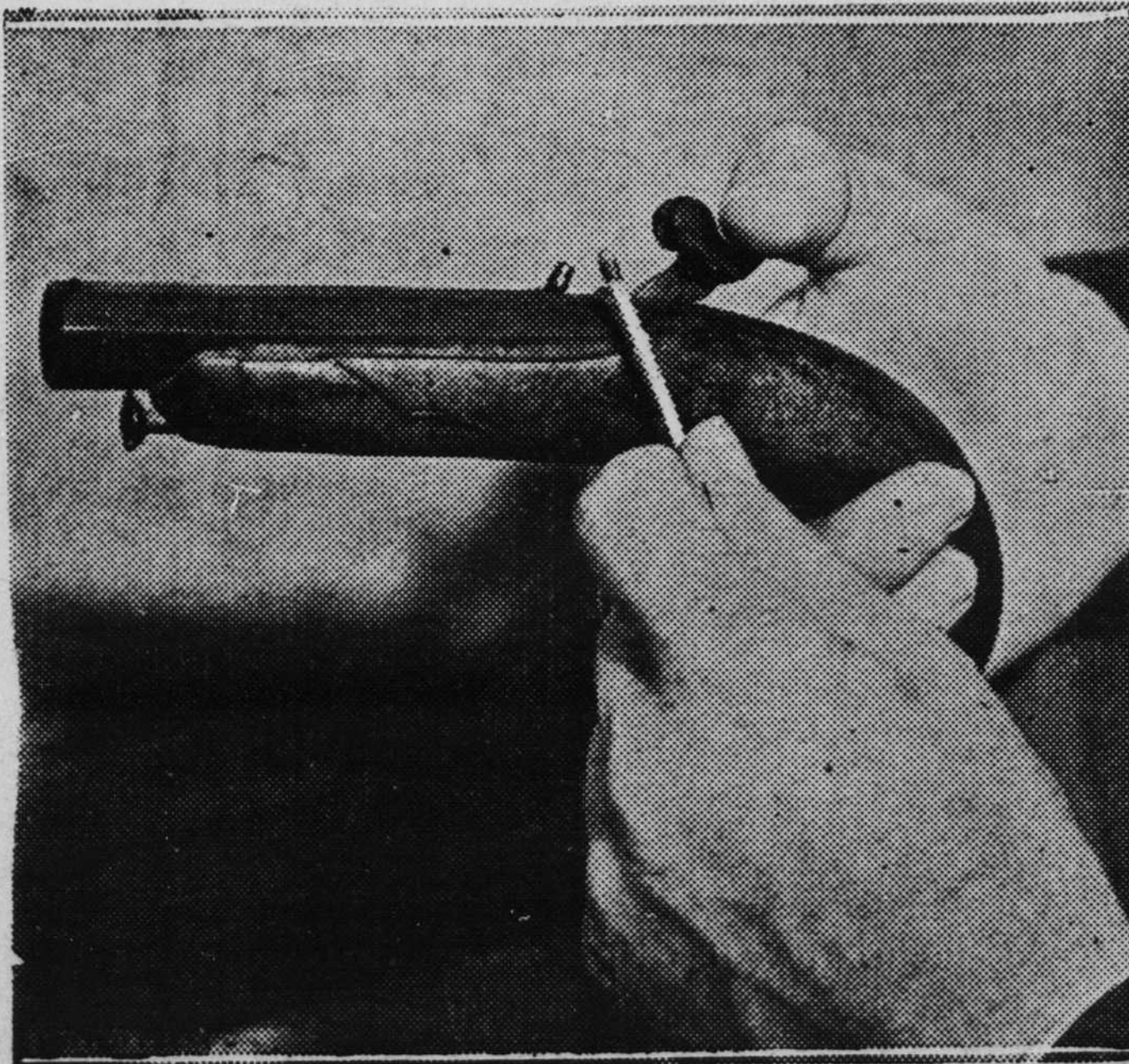
