LITTLE JUMBO MINES WILL SHIP TO SMELTER

The Little Jumbo mines, located in the New Pass district and owned by D. H. Tandy, will begin shipping ore to the smelter this week. The ore being extracted contains gold, silver and lead and is being taken from the 40-foot level. Two parallel ledges running side by side are both of good grade, the larger of which is of shipping grade and the other good milling ore.

Mr. Tandy states that the shipping ore is increasing in values, particularly in gold, and that the size of the ledge will permit the shipping of a carload a week.

On the 140-foot level the ledge is three feet in width and a drift has been started northerly on the ledge. A hoist is now in operation. — Reese River Revellie.
