SHEEP TRUCK WRECKED

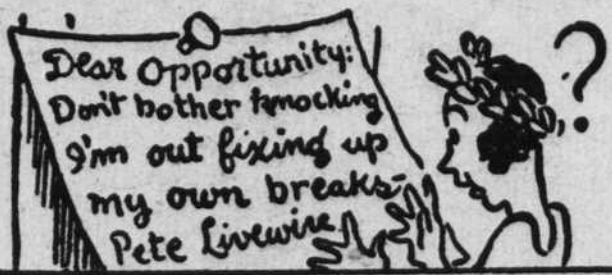
