## Masterson Heads Dentist Delegation

SAN FRANCISCO — Outstanding scientific developments of the year in the various phases of dentistry will be discussed and demonstrated before approximately nine hundred alumni of the College of Physicians and Surgeons, a dental school, at its thirty-seventh annual reunion to be held here next Monday (October 8) to Thursday.

The Las Vegas delegation will be headed by Dr. Chase H. Masterson, committee member for this district.

Dr. F. C. Elliott, of Houston, Texas, Professor of Dental Prosthesis and Dean of the Texas Dental College, nationally noted authority on prosthetic dentistry; and Dr. David W. McLean of Los Angeles, famed prosthodontist and clinician, will be guest speakers.

Clinics and lectures will be held throughout the four-day sessions, with Dr. Frederick Burlingame of San Francisco, president of the alumni association, presiding. A golf tournament Thursday, will conclude the program.

Guest lecturers and clinicians will include Dr. Robert Dunn, orthodontia specialist; Dr. Nina E. Estill, diet and nutrition expert; Dr. John Marshall, Professor of Biochemistry and Dental Pathology at University of California; Dr. Ralph A. Reynolds, specialist in endocrinology.

### Guest of Sister

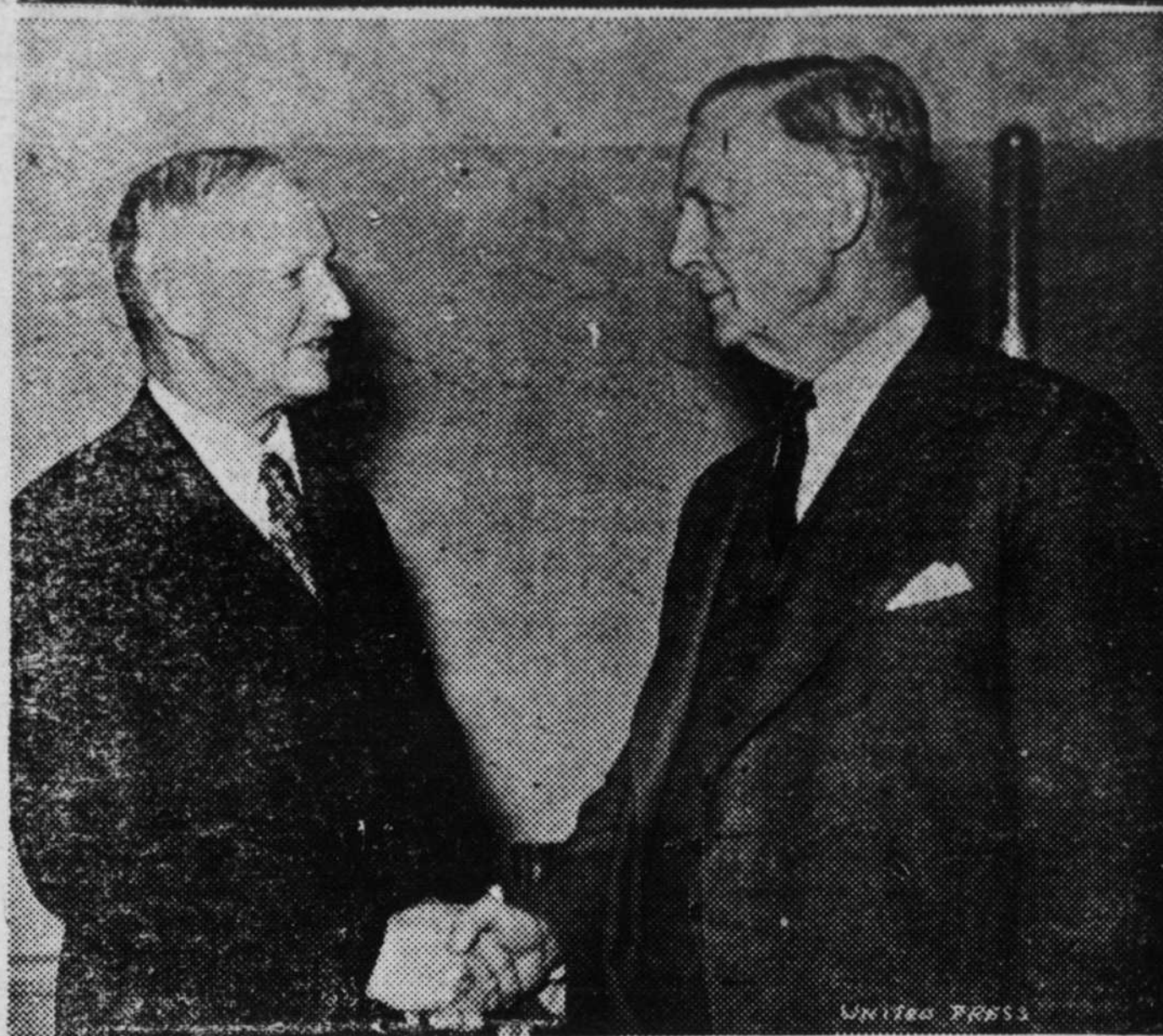
Mrs. J. C. Williams of Needles was a guest at the home of her sister, Mrs. Claude Bailey during the convention.
