**COAL FROM PIPE CAUSES GOLD RUSH AMONG MINERS**

MIDAS, Nev. — Coals from a pipe in the fingers of Albert Gabbert started a blaze recently which not only cleared a mile of ground of brush, but set off a gold placer rush such as never before was seen in the Gold Circle mining district. Wherever an old creek bed is indicated on the exposed surface men are sinking in the wash to reach the "pay gravel" at bedrock. Between the East Standard mill and the Black Cloud claim seven outfits are delving in the overburden and nearly all are finding gold in paying quantities. Many prospectors are coming in from other districts in automobiles to seek their fortunes.

Placer gold is a new thing at Gold Circle, though some \$5,000,000 has been recovered from the lode mines of the district. Conditions here are said to be identical with those at Tuscarora, Nev. 50 miles east, where between nine and ten millions in dust and nuggets was taken out in addition to \$40,000,000 from lodes.

here from Tuscorora in 1909. After the fire he was quick to recognize the possibilities of the old creek beds and with his partner, Thomas Van Orman, started a shaft on Van Orman's property, the Black Cloud. The two old men, Gabbert 90 and Van Ormand 70, did all the work on

the shaft and at 40 feet got into the gold-flecked placer bed. At first the gravel panned \$1 to \$3 a yard and by the time bed-rock was reached it was yielding \$10 to \$50 a yard for a width of 14 feet. To obtain ready money the miners are trucking the gravel to Squaw creek and washing it in a "Long Tom."
