NINETY-SIX WARDS NOW OVER THE TOP IN ERA DRIVE

Ninety-six wards were over the top early this week in the drive for subscriptions for the Improvement Era, according to O. B. Peterson, business manager. This is an increase of more than one hundred per cent in comparison with the same date last year.

Five stakes went over the top during Era Week, October 14-21, and four others were nearly over, according to the figures which had been turned in. This also is a great increase over last year as only one stake was over at the close of the week in 1933.

"Whether this increase will continue remains to be seen, of course," said Mr. Peterson. "If it does, if all stakes and wards keep up their enthusiasm, The Era will be on splendid footing during the coming year."

The stakes now over the top are: Montpelier, Snowflake, Twin Falls, Maricopa, and Curlew. Zion Park, Lyman, St. Joseph and Union Stakes are nearing the one hundred per cent of their quota.

Mrs. Lewis Prichard entertained Wednesday evening, with a Halloween party at her home, for her Sunday school class.

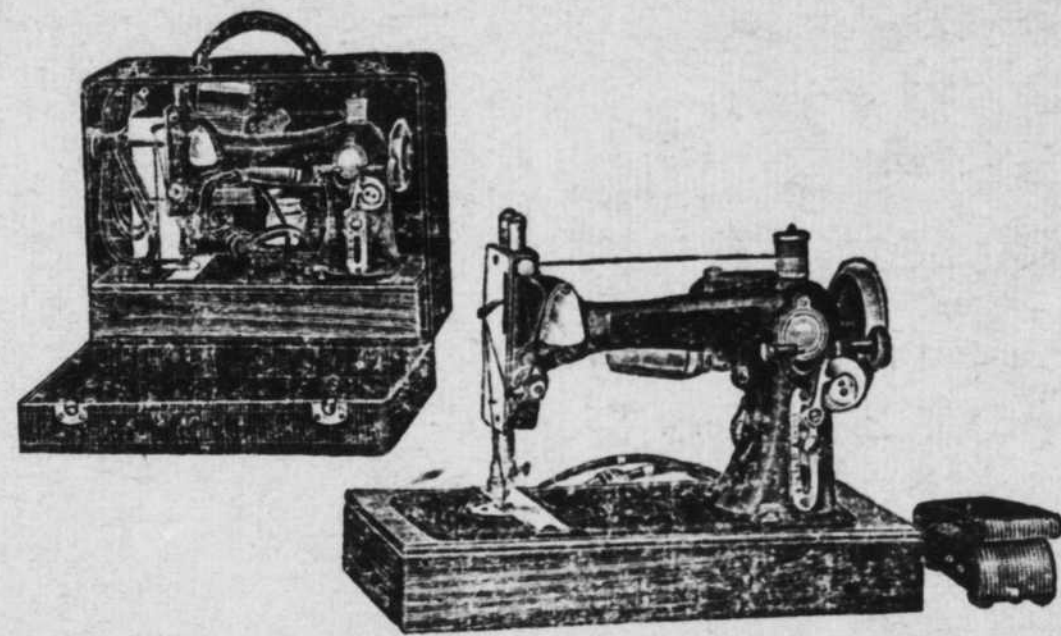
M. I. A. Entertained Halloween
