GOLD PRODUCTION INCREASING
IN GOLD CIRCLE DISTRICT

MIDAS, Nev. - Gold in every form-bullion and concentrates from the mills, dust and nuggets from the placers and high-grade smelting ore from the lodes-is swelling the output of the Gold Circle mining district. Placer production is becoming increasingly important. In addition to the recoveries of an Orman an dGabbert from their original strike in the Black Cloud. Bob Richardson and partner are slucing about 10 tons a day of gravel that carries some \$10 to the yard. Johnson & Conn are piling up about 5 yards of \$20 gravel daily which they will haul to Squaw creek for washing next week. Brinton & Co. are searching for the channel on the East Standard and J. B. Lamb of California is getting ready to put in a steam shovel near the mouth of Midas gulch south of town.

The Gold Circle Consolidated mill has just shipped 500 pounds of gold bullion to the Selby smelter. The East Standard mill has a cleanup of amalgum ready for market and the lessees on the Rabbits Foot block of the Standard are preparing a shipment of high grade smelting ore.

About 50 tons a day are being milled by the Gold Circle Consolidated. Pliant Brothers have their new 50-ton flotation mill nearly completed and are planning to run it all winter with water from a deep well bored at the mouth of their tunnel. They have a fine body of mill ore blocked in their Esmeralda mine which joins the East Standard on the southwest.

The Eash Standard has completed new buildings over two of its three pumping stations and installed a new engine and pump to return the water from its settling pond.

A shipment of good ore is reported from the Carlo lease on the Water Witch claim next to the Miners Gold property.
