He is able to eat meagerly, beginning with a "square meal" consisting of one ounce of cream of wheat and cream, which is being increased in amount, with the addition of orange juice and raw egg by way of variety. It is expected that he will rapidly regain his health and strength.

Examinations For Civil Service Open

The United States civil service commission has announced open competitive examinations as follows:

Automatic 3-A addressograph operator, \$1,400; F-1 and F-2 addressograph operator, \$1,260; graphotype operator, \$1,260 a year, departmental service.

Junior financial statistician, \$2,000 a year, securities and exchange commission.

Steel plate engraver (picture and vignette), \$19.20 a day and \$3.60 an hour for overtime, bureau of engraving and printing.

Assistant engineman, steam, electric, \$1,680 a year, departmental service. Some vacancies to be filled at \$1,860 a year.

Junior parasitologist, \$2,000 a year, bureau of animal industry department of agriculture.

Assistant foreman, brush factory (solid-back staple set brush) \$1,860 a year, Leavenworth penitentiary.

Red Cross Roll Call To Begin Monday, Nov. 12

A meeting of the Clark county chapter of the American Red Cross was held on Wednesday evening, November 7, for the purpose of formulating plans for the Annual Roll Call for members, regularly held between Armistice Day and Thanksgiving. Those present were: O. W. Yates, chairman, Bryan Bunker, Mrs. Leo McNamee, Mrs. Will Beckley, Nye Wilson, Edward W. Clark, Ira J. Earl and R. B. Griffith. Miss Watland of the National office of the Red Cross in San Francisco, discussed past Roll Call achievements and enumerated methods of procedure which insured a successful drive.

Last year Nevada won the Roll Call Honor flag by attaining the highest percentage of Red Cross members of any state in the union. This trophy is on display in the capitol at Carson City and all chapters in Nevada will make a supreme effort to retain it for another year. Clark county made an exceptional record in their 1933 Roll Call and, with the excellent volunteer group which has offered to assist this year, there is every indication that the past record will be equaled or even exceeded.

Mr. Yates has appointed Mr. Bunker as Roll Call chairman for Clark county and Mr. Bunker asks that every man and woman respond generously and cheerfully when approached by a Red Cross solicitor next week.

Mr. Bunker announces the appointment of Mrs. Harley A. Harmon as Red Cross Roll Call chairman for the city of Las Vegas. Mrs. Harmon has selected Mrs. Frank Frank Garside as her assistant.
