TRI-STATE GOLF TOURNAMENT IS TO START HERE

The start of the tri-state tournament between Needles, California, Las Vegas, Nevada, and the Kingman Country club will start this year with the first play of the tournament being held at the local golf course on Sunday, November 18th. The emblem of the championship between the three clubs is a fine silver loving cup. This cup has been held by the Las Vegas club during the past year, that club having taken the measure of the two other clubs when last year's play was completed at Las Vegas.

Kingman won the tournament the first year that the cup was put in play, by taking the three matches in very decisive manner, and the local golfers will make every effort to regain it this year.

Following the play at Kingman on the 18th, the second leg of the tournament will be held at Las Vegas, the date to be decided when the three teams meet here. This will be followed by the final and deciding match being played on the Needles golf course.

Lease on the Silver Bell claims, eight miles from Pioche, Nev., have

been purchased from Wallace Leavitt by interests represented by C. M. Zabriski, who operated in the Tintic, Utah, district so many years. Equipment is being installed.

DROUGHT RELIEF WATER DEVELOPMENT GOES ON

The work of equipping the drought relief well dug by the FERA well-diggers in Grass valley, several miles north of the Grass Valley ranch, has been completed. Windmill, pump and stock water tank are all in place and the well is now in service.

Water from the well dug in Grass valley on this side of the Grass Valley ranch, which developed an artesian flow, is running over the top in undiminished volume. This splendid flowing well which will require no pumping will be a permanent convenience of inestimable value to stockmen.

Under the direction of Marshall Woodward, engineer in charge of the drought relief water development in this part of Lander county, W. L. Peterson of Eureka, professional well driller who has contracted for the work, has had his drilling rig at work this week drilling a well near Cape Horn in Smoky valley about one-eighth of a mile from the Lincoln highway. The rig is said to work most satisfactorily and good progress has been made. — Austin Sun.

3 CARS CATTLE SHIPPED

Three cars of cattle consisting of 81 head were shipped from Mason and Smith Valleys recently under the government's drought relief program, according to Otto R. Schultz, county director. This program is now drawing to a close and it is estimated that probably one more carload will be shipped next week to complete the program in this county. Farmers having animals to dispose of through this channel should make listings immediately.
