## Albright Youth Dies From Burns

Kenneth Albright, 17, passed away Wednesday afternoon at the Las Vegas hospital from severe burns received Monday afternoon when a torch exploded.

Kenneth was inside the large garage building at Ladd's camp working on a Boulder Dam model when the blow torch exploded. Jack Albright grabbed the torch and ran towards the door, where Kenneth collided with him, upsetting the torch and spraying them both with hot liquid and setting their clothing afire.

The younger boy, who apparently was badly frightened, started running, and the flames spread thru his clothing. Several bystanders attempted to catch him, but he eluded them, and was finally stopped when a resident of a nearby cabin threw a bucket of water in his face.

Jack, whose clothes were also on fire, rolled on the floor until the flames were extinguished, and suffered only minor burns.

Kenneth has resided in Las Vegas only a short time, having come here last summer to be with his brothers, who are prominent Las Vegas business men and are engaged in building a \$5,000 model of the Boulder Canyon project.
