## ROOSEVELT WITHDRAWS ALL WESTERN LAND; MINERS PUZZLED

Secretary of the Interior Harold L. Ickes announced recently the withdrawal of all public lands in the 12 western states, temporarily, from location, settlement, sale of homesteading. The order will be in effect probably not longer than six months, and is to effectuate conservation aims of the Taylor grazing law.

According to the Reno Gazette telegrams were sent immediately from that city to Washington to ascertain if the president's order would interfere with the location of mining claims during the withdrawal period.

An immediate interpretation of the order was requested, and if the blanket withdrawal proclaimed included mineral entries, the president will be asked to modify it immediately, it was said.—Ely Record.
