A meeting of the study club of the Catholic church was held Wednesday afternoon at the parish house.

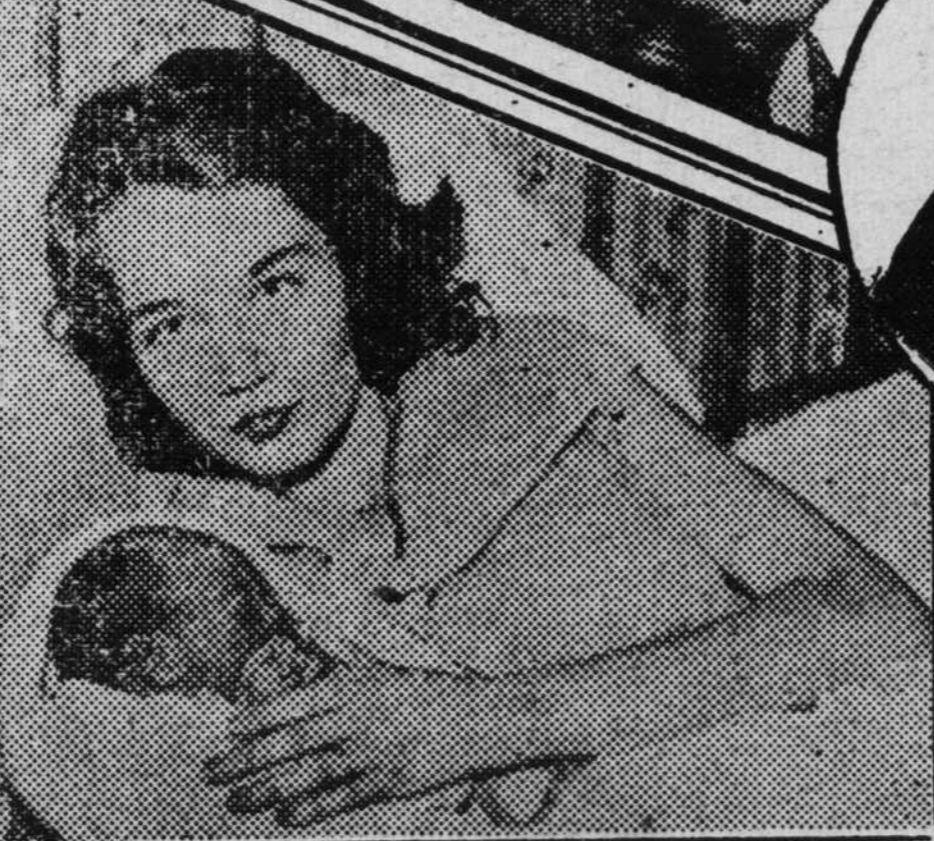

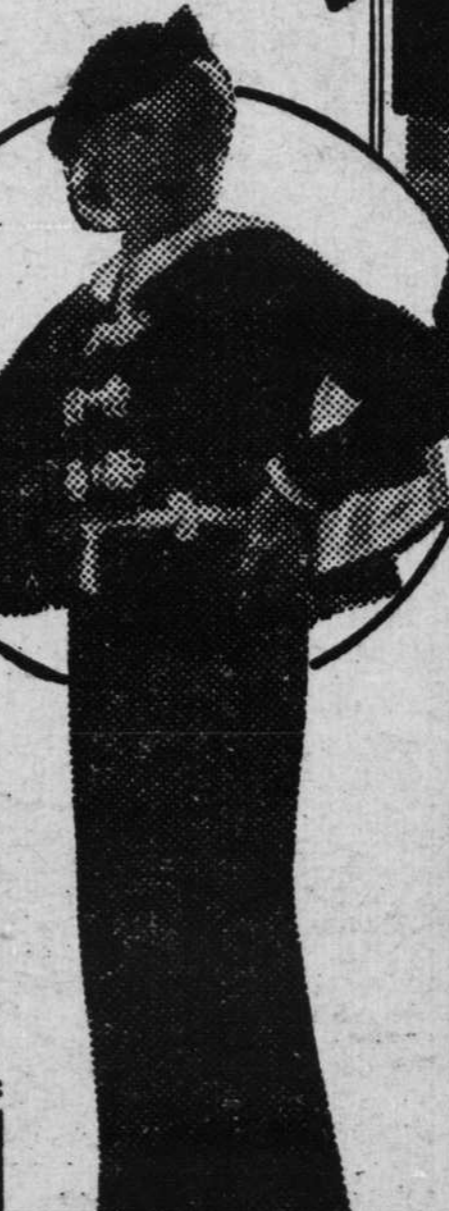

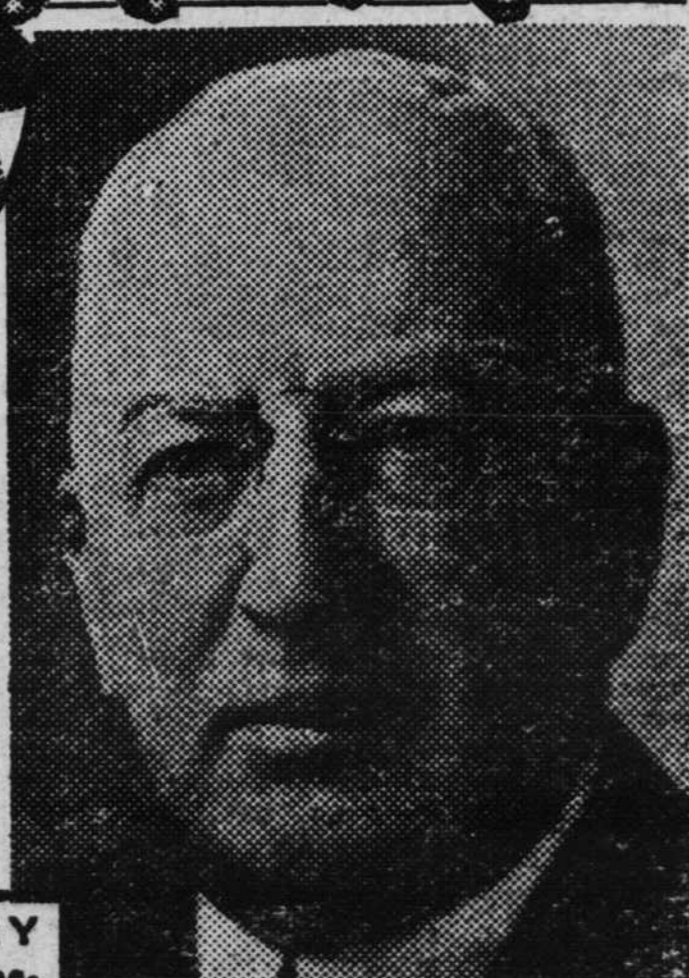
