RELIEF EXPENSE SHOWN

In the seven months starting last April 1 and ending October 31 a total of \$1,557,448.37 was expended by the Nevada FERA of which \$266,-030.91 was charged to administrative expenses or 17.1 per cent, according to figures released by Frank Upman, FERA administrator for Nevada. The administrative expenses dropped from 37.4 per cent of the total in April to 12.6 per cent in October, according to Upman's figures but it was explained that the April figures included a considerable carry over from the CWA organization in April and March.
