The Chiquita, as for the past two years, is quietly and efficiently developing ore, adding large tonnage each month to its already vast ore resources. Machinery for mill, bought some months ago, is at Goodsprings ready for assemblying at the mine. However, because of the much greater area and volume of the ore bodies than was at first evident, the company now plans to erect a mill with a capacity of probably 800 tons a day instead of the smaller one first planned.
