12,000 Damage Caused by Fire

LEWISTON, Ida. — Fire destroyed several warehouses, 16 freight cars and more than 100,000 bushels of wheat at Sweetwater, southeast of here, causing damage estimated between \$150,000 and \$200,000.

The flames, believed to have started in an elevator owned by the Lewiston Grain Growers, Inc., were first seen at 6 o'clock and spread rapidly, fanned by a brisk wind.

Much of the grain stored in the warehouses was the property of farmers, no warehouse receipts having been issued. Warehouses and the elevator were insured.

Power Line To Relieve Haefeli

RENO — D. C. Haefeli, public works administrator for Nevada, who is helping to guide the destinies of the Boulder dam-Pioche powerline, the state's most ambitious electrical distribution project, said he will be relieved when

the jobs get under way.

Start of construction has been predicted at "two weeks away" for some time, the PWA head has uncalls from newspapermen wanting to know "Has that first shovelful of dirt been turned yet."

The Lincoln county power district is now awaiting approval by a firm of national bond counselors before proceeding with the sale of a \$300,000 bond issue to pay for its share of the cost.

All contracts necessary to start

work on the powerline have been approved, and final okay on the legal status of the bond issue will be the signal for many of the contracting firms to commence filling orders for material.

The \$300,000 bond issue is expected to be disposed of among mining and industrial concerns interested in the power district companies holding construction and supply contracts on the project will absorb \$75,000 of the bonds.

Chocolate Velvet Cream

1 square unsweetened chocolate; 1 cup milk; 1 tablespoon granulated gelatin; ½ cup sugar; ½ teaspoon salt; 1 cup heavy cream; ½ teaspoon vanilla.

Add chocolate to ¼ cup milk and heat in double boiler. Soak gelatin in remaining ¾ cup milk 5 minutes. When chocolate is melted, beat with rotary egg beater until blended. Add gelatin, sugar, and salt, and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Cool. Add cream and vanilla. Chill until cold and syrupy. Place in bowl of cracked ice or ice water and whip with rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick like whipped cream. Turn into individual molds. Chill only until firm. Unmold. Garnish with whipped cream. Serves 6.
