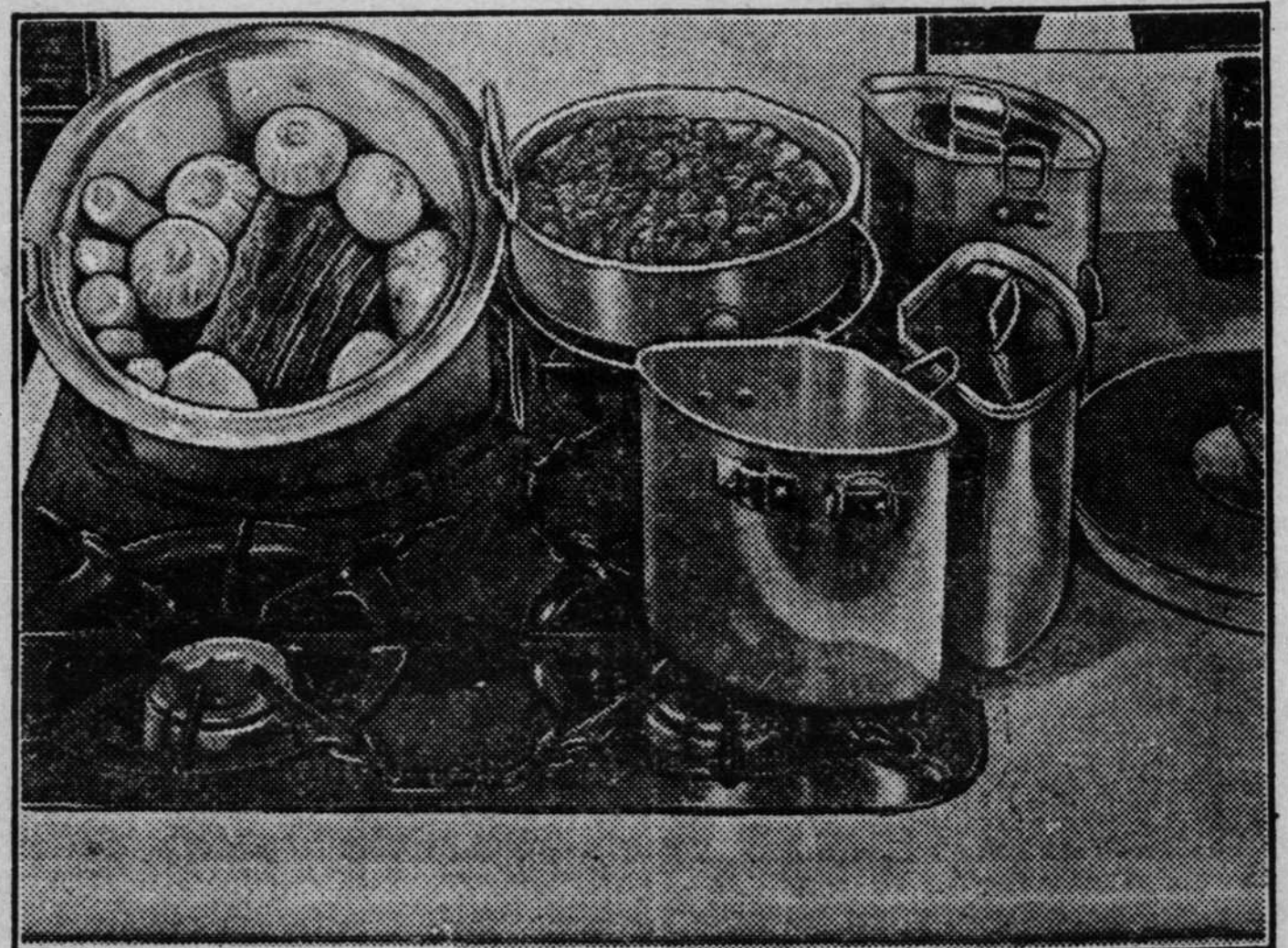
### MID-NIGHT MASS AT CHRIST CHURCH

## Meals Like Mother Used to Make



BACK in the darker ages when you were young, plenty of good food emerged from the old iron kettle atop the cookstove. Today the economy cooker conveniently permits the addition of dessert and cooks everything over one burner. If your modern automatic gas range lacks this type of cooker which is built into the range, a large kettle with close fitting cover having a vent in it to allow the escape of steam may be used over a top burner. The flame is reduced to

a simmer once cooking begins. The dinner shown includes a three pound pot roast of beef (either chuck or rump), potatoes, whole onions and carrots, cooked with but half a cup of water; also a steamed cherry batter pudding. Shoulder or breast of veal stuffed and rolled, pork, or chicken and dumplings offer variety; for dessert, try a combination of dried fruits, custard, apple sauce, or such puddings as rice, bread, molasses, chocolate or fruit.
