Notice is hereby given that on the 21st day of November, 1936, in accordance with Section 59, Chapter 59, of the Statutes of 1919, W. C. Morgan of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada, made application to the State Engineer of Nevada for permission to appropriate 1-40th of a second foot of the public waters of the State of Nevada. Diversion is to be made from Point Spring at a point in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 11, T. 22 S., R. 58 E., M. D. B. & M., or at a point from which the N. W. corner of said section 11 bears N. 39 deg 24 min. W., 940 feet. Water will be conveyed by means of a pipe line to a trough located in the same subdivision as the point of diversion, and there used for watering 200 cattle and 23 horses from January 1st to December 31st of each year. National Guard Finance Report

Adjutant General Jay H. White in his report to Governor Richard Kirman of date December 31, 1936, submits the following summary of the financial side of the Nevada State National Guard:

Total cost National Guard of United States to federal government, fiscal year 1936, \$38,005,559.

Per capita cost, federal government, based on strength of 200,000 men and 12,000 officers, \$179.27.

Per capita cost, State of Nevada (F. Y. 1936), based on strength of 254 men and 18 officers, expenditures being \$10,317.50—\$37.93.

Per capita cost each citizen in the United States, based on population of 125 million, \$0.304.

Per capita cost each citizen in Nevada to support Nevada National Guard (based on population of one hundred thousand (100,000), \$0.193.

Cost per citizen in state per year,

based on estimated yearly budget of \$7,000.00—\$0.070.

Irrespective whether Nevada had a State National Guard it can be properly assumed that each citizen would at least theoretically have to pay \$0.304 a year to maintain the Guard of the nation.

This would bring up the question of whether it is more to the interest of all citizens in the state of Nevada to pay \$30,400.00 in indirect Guard of the nation, or whether to

pay about \$37,400.00 in direct and taxes each year to support the indirect taxes each year to support the Nevada National Guard as well as the Guard of the nation, and by so doing realize a 75.11 per cent return on both direct and indirect taxes. The federal government spent on the Nevada National Guard for fiscal year 1936, \$28,093.00.
